**What is Title I?**

David L. Rainer Elementary School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

**School Plan for Shared Student Achievement**

**What is it?** This is a plan that describes how David L. Rainer Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. David L. Rainer Elementary School values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that David L. Rainer Elementary School will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

**How is it developed?** David L. Rainer Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and provide feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey (online and paper sent home) that asks parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement.

**What feedback was indicated?** The yearly survey showed that parents prefer information instead of workshops on improving math skills, reading skills, and on test preparation. Parents also prefer workshops held in the afternoon and evening over morning and lunch times. Activities will be planned to address these needs during the 2017-18 school year.

**Who is it for?** All students and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. David L. Rainer Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of students with disabilities, parents of migratory children, as well as guardians of children served through the Methodist Children's Home. David L. Rainer Elementary School will offer childcare and transportation to the extent practicable upon request.

**Where is it available?** Once adopted, the plan is posted on the school website, in the parent resource center, and in the front office.

**Elementary School Promotion Standards**

Grades 1-5

Students must pass language arts, reading, mathematics, science, and social studies and connections courses as they apply.

All students in grades 1-2 must have a passing final grade of "2" or higher in language arts and mathematics; and "S" for satisfactory in science and social studies.

- All students in grades 3 – 5 must have passing final grades of 70% or higher in language arts, reading, mathematics, science, and social studies.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade students must also pass the Reading of the Georgia Milestones EOG.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade students must also pass the Reading AND Mathematics portions of the Georgia Milestones EOG. Click [HERE](#) for further information

### 2017-18 District Goals

- To increase the percentage of 3-12 grade students designated as proficient or higher on the ELA GMAS from 51% in 2017 to 54% in 2018, 57% in 2019, and 60% in 2020.
- Increase the percentage of all students designated as proficient or higher on the Math GMAS from 55% in 2017 to 58% in 2018, 61% in 2019, and 64% in 2020.

### 2017-18 School Goals

- To increase the ELA GMAS (Georgia Milestones Assessment System) performance from 54% to 57% with an increased emphasis on writing in every content area.
- To increase the Math GMAS performance from 58% to 61%.
