Parent's Right to Know

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

LAW – SECTION 1116, 1112(E)(3)(C), AND 1112(E)(4) OF ESSA.

Parent Notification

- Right to Know Parent Notification Section 1112 (e) (1)(A)
 - In Georgia in accordance with ESSA, schools are REQUIRED to notify parents at the beginning of EACH school year of their right to know the Professional Qualification of their student's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals
 - This notice is provided each year in each school's electronic student handbook. Though this is a Title I law, direct your questions to Dr. Jon Miller; this is under his purview.
- 20 Day Notifications (Section 1112(e)(1)(B)(ii)
 - In Georgia, in accordance with ESSA all schools are required to provide timely notice to parents when students have been assigned or taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet applicable State certification or licensure requirements or professional qualifications
- Though this is a Title I law, direct your questions to Mr. Boatright; this is under his purview.

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

LAW – SECTION 1116, 1112(E)(3)(C), AND 1112 (E)(4) OF ESSA.

EL Parent Notification – Section 1112(e)(3)(A) and 1112(e)(4)

- Schools are REQUIRED to notified parents of English Learners who have been selected to participate in the use of supplemental support during ESOL services (i.e., Exact Path, Reading Eggs, Reading ESL etc.)
- To the extent placatable, the notification shall be in an understandable language and format parents can understand.
- Notification must be sent no later than 30 CALENDAR days after the beginning of the school year.
- For newly identified ELs, notification must be sent during the first two weeks of the EL being placed in ESOL.
- Parents have the right to waive services, but the EL must participate in the ACCESS assessment and score a 5.0 to exit the program (Reclassification is an option for exiting without a 5.0 score).
- Communicate with the Special Education Teacher should the English Learner be a SWD.
